



For those who want to learn how to excel, both professionally and personally, our article about Leadership Fairfax is a must read.





Congratulations to the 2017 Best Of Reston Honorees

FOR MAKING RESTON A BETTER PLACE

n April 16, at the 26th Cornerstones of Our Community Best of Reston Awards Gala held at the Reston Hyatt Regency Hotel, seven awards were given to recognize the great body of work of the many fine people, businesses, and organizations involved in giving back to the greater Reston/Dulles corridor.

The annual event has been presented in partnership for 26 years by Cornerstones and the Greater Reston Chamber of Commerce to raise funds for Reston's premier, nonprofit social services organization while showcasing community and corporate involvement.

Honorees were selected from a group of 22 finalists (check our March-April edition to see the list of finalists) announced on February 9. Once again, Phil Tobey (2001 Best of Reston Honoree) was the Master of Ceremonies while Charlene Wheeless, Bechtel (2016 Best of Reston Honoree), and Doug Bushee, CORE Foundation (2013 Best of Reston Honoree), were the Gala Chairs. Kerrie Wilson, CEO of Cornerstones, and Mark Ingrao, president of the Greater Reston Chamber of Commerce, shared the podium to express their gratitude for all the selfless contributions the finalists and nominees have made to the community which have changed the lives of many underprivileged people.

"We believe that our job is to END homelessness – not just manage it – by developing housing that is affordable for people over their lifetime. We are so grateful for the incredible support that helps Cornerstones and its partners reduce homelessness in our community by 47 percent in the past eight years." said Wilson.

"We are known as a Chamber with a social conscience and our members, through their time, talent, and treasure, help us live up to that moniker every day. The Chamber treasures the powerful partnership that is alive today with Cornerstones. As we look at the future, we are excited about the possibilities and about the next generation of leaders."

A \$515,435 check-funds raised through this year's Best of Reston event-was presented to Cornerstones to support the organization's strategies of starting individuals on a pathway to sustainable living-wage employment, and to identify and address other barriers to move from surviving to living prosperous, healthy lives.

CIVIC-COMMUNITY Organization Award

This award was given to two organizations: to Women Giving Back for helping women dress for success no matter where they are on life's journey. They serve approximately 23,000 women and over 15,300 children with personal service, boutique attention, and the encouragement of 800 active volunteers.

LARGE BUSINESS SERVICE AWARD

Odin, Feldman and Pittleman, P.C., for their belief that if you do what is right, then you have done what is best. They are mentors for local students at Dogwood Elementary School and board members for many nonprofits, including Cornerstones and Life With Cancer.

INDIVIDUAL COMMUNITY LEADER AWARD

Bill Keefe was awarded for his generous gifts of time, talent, treasure, and lifelong devotion to this community, which make him the quintessential Restonian. He has been both a coach and a referee for Reston Youth Basketball and Reston Youth Baseball; he has served as board member for Reston Community Center and Reston Association; he has served on Reston's Planning and Zoning Committee, giving his knowledge of planning and his steadfast commitment to the Reston values of inclusion and the celebration of both natural and human-made beauty.

FAMILY SERVICE AWARD

This award went to Vincent and Gillian Sescoe. Knowing that self-sufficiency begins with self-confidence, these two teach by example with love. Gillian coaches those seeking to become citizens, and has helped more than 100 people from 22 countries become part of our national tapestry. Vince has volunteered nearly 20 years in programs that provide people with job search and interview skills.



ROBERT E SIMON LIFETIME **ACHIEVEMENT AWARD**





RESTON'S FOUNDER'S DAY FOUNDER

2004: First Founder's Day Gurprise

Bronze Bob, named "Untold Stories," is Reston's Iconic, Most-Visited and Best-Loved Public Art

April 10, 2004 was going to be Bob Simon's 90th Birthday and the Board of the Reston Museum and Historic Trust (RHT) wanted this milestone to be especially memorable.

In April 2003, they called RHT board director Charles Veatch, a member of Reston's first residential sales team (1964), close friend of Reston's founder and an active member of the Reston community.

A graduate of the University of Virginia's McIntire School of Commerce, Veatch had been impressed by a special UVA tradition that dated back 178 years. To honor the University's Founder Thomas Jefferson, the first graduating class of 1825 inaugurated Founder's Day.

Instead of a more common birthday celebration, Veatch suggested that this event take on a more exceptional tradition: the creation of Reston's very own Founder's Day!

Furthermore, recalling the Jefferson statue on the grounds of The University in Charlottesville, Veatch proposed that the Historic Trust Board create a Bob Simon statue

20 RESTON * MAY // JUNE 2017 as a very special, fitting gift to the Reston community.

The Board liked this idea, so Veatch called the Zachary Oxman Studios in Bethesda, Maryland. Oxman grew up in Reston and was now on the world stage having had his work added to The White House art collection.

Oxman loved the concept and came out to Reston to brainstorm with Veatch. Eventually, the board agreed that a Jefferson-like statue was much too traditional. Instead, they wanted a statue to capture one of Simon's best known characteristics—his love of engaging with members (especially the children) of the Reston community.

It was decided that Simon should be seated on a bench overlooking his beloved Lake Anne Village Center. The statue's "attitude" should be one of inviting a visitor to sit down and have a chat with the founder.

Bob would love this concept. But how to keep it a secret? The board went into "stealth mode!" Bob's wife Cheryl had just purchased a new camera, and she lured Simon to strike a welcoming pose seated on the bench. She shot 30 images so that Oxman could develop a perfect clay model replica that would be bronzed at a foundry.

But keeping this quiet was a monumental (pun intended) undertaking. First, to pay Oxman's fees, Veatch opened his extensive Rolodex and made calls to 40 Restonians to open their wallets and contribute \$1,000 each. The response was immediate! Veatch dubbed these faithful Reston friends "The Founder's Day 40."

Next, the statue concept had to be approved by both the Lake Anne and Reston Association Architectural Review Boards. The now clandestine approval process was greatly aided by local architect Mike Miller.

Everyone involved was sworn to secrecy and Bronze Bob (BB-nicknamed "Untold Stories"), at the apex of the new Founder's Day, was unanimously approved

However, there was a huge problem.

For BB to fit perfectly on the bench, feet touching the Plaza bricks, the real bench (bolted firmly onto the deck of Washington Plaza) had to be taken to Oxman's studio without Simon suspecting that something was going on.

This bench had to be unbolted and secretly abducted!

And the men for this job were Oxman and Veatch. Oxman drove his van up to the bench and the two removed the bolts holding the bench. Just as they were finishing this task, the founder himself started walking toward them from Heron House on his way to a bank meeting.

Veatch and Oxman threw the bench into the van and dove onto the floor. They prayed that Simon wouldn't stop and look in. Like two skilled jewel thieves, the two men lay perfectly still. Fortunately, a woman engaged Simon as he was walking up to the van and the crisis was prolonged as Simon chatted on and on with the visitor. Finally, he moved on to his meeting at the bank.

The bench made it to Oxman's studio without being missed. The statue was successfully cast and bolted to the bench. "Untold Stories" was finally reinstalled on Lake Anne Plaza the night before the first

Flowers and candles festooned BB when Simon passed at age 101. Hundreds of thousands of family photos and videos have been taken with BB over the course of the past 13 years.

Ground Breaking FOR HUNTER'S WOODS AT TRAILS EDGE

Senior Living Community: Fulfilling Bob Simon's Dream

Presiding over the March groundbreaking ceremonies at the site of the United Christian Parish Church on Colts Neck Road, David A. Ross, Atlantic Realty Company's (ARC) founder and president, realized the fruition of a decades-old dream.

No stranger to planned communities, Ross in the 1980s had earned his developer stripes with rival new town Columbia, Maryland developer James W. Rouse. From Rouse, Ross understood the value of

delivering a wide range of housing types and amenities that make planned communities exceptional.

When he established ARC in 1992, Ross knew that to make his commercial real estate development firm successful, he needed to be involved with the communities he was helping develop. Over the years, he served as President/Chairman of the Greater Reston Chamber of Commerce and the National Capital Region of the Easter

Seals Society, Chairman of the Steering Committee for Reston Interfaith, and was selected as Reston's Citizen of the Year by the *Times Community Newspapers*, to name a few.

When ARC purchased the United Christian Parish site in 2007, Ross wanted to bring to Reston a unique, state-of-the-art senior living community. He carefully chose partners who understood the growing needs of seniors in a rapidly expanding, maturing healthcare-provider industry.

He looked for a team of professionals who value a deep sense of satisfaction gained from the knowledge that their work will play an important role in enriching the experiences of those who live, work, learn, and play in the buildings they design and build.

For his Hunters Woods at Trails Edge team, Ross called on some old friends who had helped him design and build the highly successful Plaza America office and retail complex in north Reston.

For his architect, he called on the Fairfax office of Moseley Architects, a full service architectural, engineering, planning, and interior design firm. In 2012, Moseley merged with senior living specialists BeeryRio, one of the nation's leading architectural firms in the field.

For his builder, Ross selected 80-year-old Balfour Beatty Construction Services US, cited by Engineering News-Record as a Top 10 Domestic Building Contractor and Top 10 Green Builder. For financial services, Ross reached out to Boston-based AEW Capital Management, a provider of real estate investment management services to investors worldwide. AEW Global manages \$57.4 billion of real estate assets and securities.

For the heart of this Hunters Woods operation, Ross searched for the region's most exceptional operator. He found his answer in IntegraCare, manager of 14 successful senior living communities in Pennsylvania, Maryland, and Virginia.

"The addition of this senior-living community to Reston is a promotion of founder Bob Simon's vision of providing for people throughout their entire lives. This project supports this by providing the fullest range of housing, styles and prices."

"Between now and January 2019, we will transform this 4.3-acre United Christian Parish site into the finest state-of-the-art facility in the mid-Atlantic."

The IntegraCare facility will have 210 senior-living units — including 90 independent living units, 81 for assisted living, 24 for memory care, and 15 for special needs. This includes a unique memory care garden, dining rooms, family/living rooms, activity rooms, fitness centers, an art studio, salon, and underground parking.

An aspect of this project that Ross is particularly excited about is the proximity to a host of stimulating recreational opportunities for the active residents—like the 50 programs targeted to seniors and venues offered by the Reston Community Center located across Colts Neck Road. In addition, the property is connected by an underpass to the Hunters Woods Village Center with its diversity of shopping, grocery, drug stores, and eateries.

As part of its partnership with the community, Ross has offered to contribute \$81,300 to improve pedestrian trails and pathway lighting within a half-mile of the facility; as well as \$60,000 to target improvement of the facade of the Colts Neck pedestrian underpass, in coordination with Public Art Reston and Reston Association. Lastly, \$20,000 is being provided for capital improvements to the Reston Association's Nature House.

"This is really a once-in-a-career opportunity, to be involved in a project that has the nature of this program," said Rick Irwin, IntegraCare's CEO. "We are grateful for all the possibilities offered by the Reston and Southgate Community Centers next door, where our residents can feel our support and care, maximize their independence, and have such good access within the fabric of the Reston Community." *



Originally from Massachusetts, Robert Goudie moved to Reston from New York City in 1998 for job purposes. Being a general counsel for an international high tech company based in Europe, he purchased a townhouse at the West Market so that he could walk to his office at the Reston Town Center. Little did he know that this move would be the beginning of a life-changing experience for him and for the community of Reston.

Inspired by his parents' philosophy of "those who can, should", Goudie got involved with and became president of the home owners association at West Market, improving the community he was very proud of. He got involved with Cornerstones, the arts, and the big planning effort to grow the community of Reston about six years ago.

"I was one of the people appointed by the supervisor to the special master plan study task force, that was looking at how we were going to re-plan Reston with the Metro coming," he said. He served as the Town Center residential representative, and later he co-chaired a committee on that task force with Peter Otteni from Boston Properties, creating a report that the Board of Supervisors ultimately adopted. "We focused a lot on jobs to household ratios so that we could try to mitigate traffic, and what it takes to create dynamic communities," he explained.

Art is a Necessity of the Good Life

Goudie has also been involved with the Greater Reston Arts Center (GRACE) for the last four years as board chair.

"What GRACE is doing is not only consistent with Reston Founder Bob Simon's original view of the Reston community, but no less than two of seven of his founding principles had to do with art; specifically, that art is a necessity of the good life," said Goudie. "What we're doing is not only furthering his vision, but also helping fulfill his notion of Reston being a complete community."

After being in a difficult financial situation a few years ago, GRACE has rebounded and, for the first time, the arts center has reserves.

"We have completely reshaped the vision for the center, so we've built what we call the 'Destination GRACE Vision'." said Goudie.

The arts center is also committed to bringing art to the elementary classrooms through its GRACE Art Program, where parents volunteer to present a different artist profile every month, and the children create a piece of art based on the artist's style. The program is currently in 40 schools reaching 20,000 kids.

"At a time where art budgets are under pressure because public dollars are under pressure, we think this is a way to efficiently deliver art education and art history through enrichment experience to our elementary-aged kids," he said. "We're also really excited to be partnering with the Reston Association to provide the art summer camps through their summer camp programming."

A third exhibit, "The Great Dismal Swamp" by the nationally recognized painter, sculptor, and mixed-media artist Radcliffe Bailey, opened April 21 and will be on exhibit until July 8.

"Bailey is in the Metropolitan Museum of Fine Art in Manhattan, N.Y., he has a piece that's a part of the inaugural collection at the newly opened African American Museum in D.C., he had a solo exhibition at the High Museum of Art in Atlanta—one of the leading art institutions in the country—so we're incredibly lucky to get him," he said.

GRACE is also responsible for the Northern Virginia Fine Arts Festival, which will take place at the Reston Town Center on May 20-21.

"We bring more than 220 top artists from across the country," said Goudie. "Last year, it rained quite a bit, but on a good year we generate more than 30,000 visitors over the course of the weekend. So, it's not only the major fundraiser for the arts center; it's a marquee cultural event on the region's calendar."

Planning Reston for the Future

Besides his contributions to Reston's master plan and GRACE, Goudie works as the executive director of the Reston Town Center Association.

"We maintain the covenants in the town center, we maintain certain common areas, we're involved in promoting the town center, and we're very involved in putting on programming here," he said.

Through partnership with Boston Properties, Goudie works to put together a number of civic events at the RTC, including the Northern Virginia Fine Arts Festival, and he partners with the Greater Reston Chamber of Commerce to make events like the Taste of Reston and Oktoberfest a reality. He also works with the Reston Community Center to deliver a concert series of classical chamber music at the Town Square Park with the Shenandoah University Conservatory.

"We do the Washington West Film Festival. We also are involved with the holiday parade and the holiday events on Black Friday, ice skating at the pavilion, and the 5K runs," he added.

Goudie said that the Reston Town Center will grow even bigger with the new RTC West, being built on Sunset Hills Road and Town Center Parkway by JBG Companies.

"Cooper's Hawk Winery and Restaurant is coming as an anchor tenant, and other organizations have already signed, [including] a Mediterranean restaurant and retail opportunities," he said. "The developers are putting in a one-acre central plaza that's going to act as a main anchoring space."

RTC West will be a 13.78-acre campus with three newly-renovated Class A office buildings and two multi-story parking garages.

Goudie said that the open parking lot on the corner of Sunset Hills and Town Center Parkway will eventually become an extension of downtown.

"I've seen some preliminary drafts, and I can tell you that they're exciting," he said. "The buildings are empowering. The architecture is beautiful, and it's going to be great. It's part of why I'm so excited to be here—we're going through this transformation of Town Center 2.0 in a sense."

"It will have the highest densities in all of Reston with buildings taller than [the ones] here in the RTC," he said. "According to the plan [that] we helped put together, the idea is that this will be the densest of the three transit station areas along the Silver Line that are part of Reston/Herndon, including the Wiehle-Reston, the RTC and the Herndon/Monroe Metro stations."

"With Metro coming out here, and as places grow in density, one of the consequences you're going to see is an impact on the parking resource, which is scarce," he said.

Goudie is very excited about the growth Reston is experiencing: "We have the Signature site being built at the RTC, we have RTC West, and we have Lerner's redevelopment of Spectrum that is already approved by the County. That's still several years away from what I understand, but that's going to be terrific redevelopment."

Goudie explained that the redevelopment of Spectrum will include 60 percent residential and 40 percent commercial spaces, a hotel, and a series of open spaces and pathways to get in and out of the site. Soon to be announced will be the RFP (request for proposal) for the redevelopment of Town Center North, to be located where the Inova Emergency Care, the Reston Library, and the Embry Rucker Shelter are currently located. "They're ready to send out the RFP for that, which is going to involve creating a new library, new homeless shelter, all as part of the plan there," Goudie said.

"Bob always expected that Reston would continue to grow; he was very much an urbanist at heart, he was a pro-growth person," he said. "Bob was a part of the task force to his great credit, he served with all of us side by side, went to almost all the meetings, participated actively as only Bob Simon can throughout the taskforce process, and ultimately, he voted for the recommendations that we made to the board of supervisors to change the comprehensive plan."

"With Metro coming here in 2020, we projected that over the next decade or two, the existing 'town center' will double in size. This is an incredibly exciting time-just as I think Town Center is stronger and more interesting today than when I moved here 20 years ago, so do I also think that it will be stronger and more dynamic still as we embark on this new phase of Metro-related growth." *



Radcliffe Bailey: THE GREAT DISMAL SWAMP AT GRACE

The Greater Reston Arts Center (GRACE) is presenting Radcliffe Bailey: The Great Dismal Swamp, through August 18.

Radcliffe Bailey is a nationally recognized painter, sculptor, and mixed-media artist who layers imagery, culturally resonant materials, and text to explore themes of ancestry, race, and memory. The Great Dismal Swamp is the artist's first solo exhibition in the D.C. metro area. He has previously participated in group exhibitions at the Smithsonian Institution, the Corcoran Gallery of Art, and the David C. Driskell Center at the University of Maryland.

Bailey has long treated issues of race and the historical experiences of African-Americans in his work, exploring his personal ancestry as well as the history of slavery. At GRACE, Bailey will present a selection of mixed-media works mining historical themes, including the Underground Railroad and the legacy of slavery in Virginia's Great Dismal Swamp, a federally designated national wildlife refuge in southeastern Virginia. The Swamp concealed and sheltered communities of slaves fleeing captivity on the Underground Railroad.

"Viewing Radcliffe's work is like digging through strata of history, encapsulated in lush layers of paint, embodied within evocative objects, or reflected in found images of African-Americans," observed guest curator Holly Koons McCullough, formerly of GRACE and now executive director at the Arlington Arts Center. "This body of work is underpinned in part by the artist's own family history in Virginia, which was the home of both his father and grandfather. Although

deeply rooted in his personal and cultural heritage, Bailey's work ultimately addresses universal themes of identity and ancestry, hurt and healing, displacement and endurance." OTHER EVENTS:






Reston Has Always Inspired

a Gense of Wonder

Myths & Monsters of Reston, Virginia, written by two Reston friends who grew up listening to tales of the Bunny Man, the Nudist Colony, and other mysteries helps us discover our own inner child.

"Bob [Simon] was a visionary who never lost faith in big ideas," opined Judy Scott Feldman, founder and chair of the National Mall Coalition.

Thanks to the curiosity, energy and determination of longtime Reston resident and author Kristina S. Alcorn, the world has now



been treated to the extraordinary life and big ideas of Reston's founder. In her 2016 book *In His Own Words*, Alcorn invites us to listen in to hundreds of hours of intimate interviews with Reston's larger-than-life creator, taped over a period of many years.

Those of us who thought we knew him well discovered intimate stories that we had never known ones that provided rich—and often rare—insights into what shaped Reston's exceptional culture and renowned quality of life.

One who knew him better than most is Vicky Wingert, longtime Reston resident and former CEO of the Reston Association. "In his own buoyant voice, Bob Simon tells us vivid stories about his culturally rich Manhattan childhood, his trepidation at becoming president of Carnegie Hall at age 23, and his passion for creating an urban New Town from scratch in the woods and fields of Northern Virginia."

Bob Simon loved children and was a colorful storyteller! Although he passed away [at age 101] as *In His Own Words* was being written, he would have clapped with delight at the imagination and creativity that *Myths & Monsters* of Reston delivers. He would have applauded the authors' goal to encourage families to get outside and enjoy the natural beauty of Reston. It was one of the seven, original goals of his master plan: "Beauty is a necessity of the good life."

He said that Reston was meant to be a place where nature would not just coexist with humans, but would thrive. Today, Reston residents and workers enjoy more than 1,900 acres of parks and permanent natural areas. Sixty-nine miles of pathways and underpasses wind through forests and wetlands, connecting homes to schools, shops,

swimming pools, stores, ballfields, tennis courts and offices.

Authors Alcorn and MacDicken grew up along these pathways, playing as children in these woods and wetlands. So, it was natural for both to "search for critters, peek into hiding places, and let their imaginations soar," as quoted in the book's introduction.


"In His Own Words would not have been published if fate hadn't intervened on a gloomy January day," Alcorn recalls. "During a writing break, I found myself pushing an empty shopping cart around Target, pondering how to turn my unwieldy collection of digital files and photos into an actual, coherent, visually pleasing book.

"I found my answer in the cleaning supplies aisle. There, I ran into Eric MacDicken, a dear friend since our days at Langston Hughes Middle School. It had been a few years since we'd seen each other, but what could have been an awkward, 'So, what have you been doing the last decade?' conversation instead felt like no time had passed and led to a beautiful partnership."

MacDicken, a writer, art director, designer, creative consultant and illustrator, helped Alcorn produce *In His Own Words* in time for Founder's Day 2016. "We found working together such a joy that even in the thick of production we charted our next collaboration—*Myths & Monsters*," MacDicken said. Alcorn adds, "As we talked, Eric had a seemingly inexhaustible enthusiasm for all things mythical and monstrous, as well as a love of nature."

The two authors worked around the clock. especially MacDicken, who, in addition to writing, created the book's illustrations and design. For both authors, inspiration to write the book appeared throughout Reston—the forests and hollows, the miles of walking paths, the dark-water lakes and mysterious creatures that must lurk below the surface, the troll immortalized in a woodcut on the Reston Museum's window, and the ghost stories told to children to make sure they don't stay out too late on Halloween-to name a few. Such an environment helped MacDicken and Alcorn bring to life some amazing vet little known creatures rarely seen in Reston, including the Tree Hole Troll, Zombie Cows, and Annie the Lake Anne Monster.

A quote in the Introduction, by Gigi Thibodeau, a writer and adjunct professor of English at the University of Massachusetts Lowell, provides readers with an intriguing opening for the book: "Myths explain the



inexplicable: they give us meaning and purpose; they bind us to one another. The heroes and creatures of myths are as essential to our survival as the fires we light against dark and cold."

Today, Alcorn and MacDicken are working on their next project—book two of the *Myths & Monsters* series. They can't wait to share the continuing adventures of the book's characters with readers, the young and young-at-heart. •







OCEAN BLUE



Many of Northern Virginia's most successful small businesses share a similar story: They were founded by immigrants who pursued the American Dream and hit gold.

At Helga's Caterers—an award-winning, fullservice catering company founded in McLean 30 years ago—a similar story can be told.

In 1957, Dr. Peter and Helga Evans emigrated with their two young children from Germany, leaving behind the struggles of World War II and a hard life that sometimes meant existing solely on bread and butter. The couple settled in Falls Church and went on to grow their family of four to nine, while Peter became a doctor and professor of ophthalmology and chairman of ophthalmology at Georgetown University. Helga helped out by catering events at the university and in their home for her husband, and the experience helped crystallize her realization that she was looking for a new challenge. Backed by a love of cooking, some formal culinary training, and the irreplaceable experience of constantly experimenting in the kitchen for her large family, she decided that launching a catering business would be an exciting new option.

Around the same time, one of her sons, Michael, was at the Georgetown school of business, gearing his studies toward marketing a catering business while also serving an apprenticeship in Philadelphia for a leading caterer. Mother and son soon opened Helga's in McLean in 1981, a dual-operation with sit-down restaurant service and a catering service.

"We started the restaurant together," said Michael, now chef-owner of Helga's

Caterers, "thinking it would be a great way to simultaneously serve customers and market our catering business. McLean was the perfect place to start."

The venture almost immediately became a family affair, with grandmother Omi joining brothers and sisters to pitch in and help. In 1990, Helga retired, and Michael continues to grow the legacy of three generations to four.

"We decided to sell the restaurant and focus solely on catering," Michael explained, "committing ourselves to exceptional personal service and outstanding cuisine. We never forget that while we may have catered hundreds of weddings, it may be our client's first ... so our attention to personal service is paramount. Many of our staff have been with us since the start, and we share a strong passion for and love of the catering business. Food is an art, and it needs to be presented beautifully ... but service and attention to detail is equally important. We're proud of the fact that praise for our staff is as common in our reviews as is praise for our food."

Helga's caters events of all sizes, ranging from small, private family gatherings to large, corporate events; graduations, weddings and bridal showers; summer picnics; and cocktail parties, galas, and formal dinners.


"Our menus are so diverse that we can offer all-American BBQs to Hawaiian luaus to ethnic menus. Continental cuisines got us started, and German and Hungarian foods are our roots, but we do it all today, including being sensitive to dietary restrictions such as gluten-free, vegan, and paleo diets.

"In the mid 1980s," Michael added, "we partnered with the Diet Center and had a contract with the American College of Cardiology. Recipes had to be reviewed by nutritional consultants for cholesterol, fat, sodium, and calories to ensure that they were heart-healthy. We even published a cookbook, Food for Your Health, that includes nutritional counts. Today, that might not seem like much, but back then, we were ahead of our time. Our focus on nutrition since our founding has also helped differentiate our service."

Peter and Helga, now 91 and 81, are still enjoying the fruits of their family's labor, joined by seven children, 16 grandchildren, four great-grandchildren, and countless nieces and nephews who take active roles in the business.

Celebrating Mom and Dad The Origins of Mother's and Father's Days

It's that time again! Time to celebrate mothers and fathers everywhere, stepparents, foster parents, adopted family and all of those individuals who have stood in as a mother and father to make an impact on another's life. This year Mother's Day will be observed on Sunday, May 14, and Father's Day will be marked on June 18.

Have you ever wondered how these holidays came to be? You probably already knew that both are considered to be official national holidays, but you may be surprised at their respective origins.

Mother's Day

Wikipedia probably defines Mother's Day the most eloquently: "[It is] a celebration honoring the mother of the family, as well as motherhood, maternal bonds and the influence of mothers in society." A wonderful, and very true, sentiment.

The tradition of celebrating mothers, motherhood and a mother's bond goes back to ancient times, when the Greeks and Romans would perform great elaborate ceremonies for goddesses Rhea and Cybele. Over time, the observation of Mothering Sunday, the fourth Sunday of Lent, evolved, but focused more on an individual's return to their mother church than any recognition of one's mother figure. (It is still celebrated as such in many countries, including the United Kingdom.)

Mother's Day, as it is known today, really got its start in 1908, when a woman in Grafton, West Virginia, wanted to hold a memorial for her mother at the town's St. Andre's Methodist Church. Anna Jarvis, who had lost her mother in 1905, said she wanted to continue honoring her mother every year and worked to set aside a day each year to honor all mothers. The southern West Virginia church is now home to an International Mother's Day Shrine.

Don't forget! Mother's Day is Sunday. May 14 While the United States Congress initially rejected Anna's proposal in 1908, by 1911 every state was marking the day. West Virginia was the first, and soon many towns across the nation considered the yearly holiday an official one on a local level.

Mother's Day was made a national holiday in 1914 with a proclamation by Woodrow Wilson, just two years after Anna trademarked the phrase "Mother's Day" as well as "second Sunday in May" and established the Mother's Day International Association. Many mothers today didn't ever actually give birth to those

that refer to them as mothers; in many cases there is not even a relation between someone and the individual they call Mom. The day has come a long way, and now means more than it ever has!

Father's Day

The Father's Day holiday has just as much of a storied history, and a tie once again to President Woodrow Wilson. However, its start was not here in America.

A celebration of fathers, the paternal bond and a recognition of the influence of fathers in society has been marked in some way since the Middle Ages by Catholic tradition, though much earlier in the year (March 19, St. Joseph's Day). In the U.S., the first Father's Day was marked on July 5, 1908, at the Williams Memorial Methodist Episcopal Church South in Fairmont. The remembrance also stemmed from the death of a loved one, in this case the father of Grace Golden Clayton, who had been killed six months earlier in the Monongah mine disaster that took 361 lives. At least 250 fathers were lost and 1,000 children were left fatherless, so Grace urged her pastor to honor the entire group.

The observance of Father's Day did not start with the same enthusiasm as that of Mother's Day, and other subsequent attempts to establish Father's Day on a wider scale ultimately failed. Two others in 1911 and 1915 proclaimed they had established the day and were met with varying levels of success.

Enter a young woman in June 1910, Sonora Smart Todd, who organized a celebration of Father's Day in Spokane Washington, to recognize her single-parent father William Jackson Smart after learning of Anna Jarvis' sermon in West Virginia. Many years later in the 1930s, when Sonora completed her education, she began pushing for a national-level recognition of Father's Day.

A bill was proposed before Congress in 1913, and three years later President Wilson spoke at a ceremony in Spokane to say that his wish for the passage of the holiday had been met with fear by legislators that the day would be taken over by commercialization. In 1924, President Calvin Coolidge recommended the nationalization of Father's Day, but never issued a proclamation. It was not until 1966 that the proclamation would finally be made by Lyndon B. Johnson, and it took another six years after that for Richard Nixon to sign the bill into law to permanently make the third Sunday of each June Father's Day. Whew! It was a long 60-year road to an annual day we now feel like has been around forever. In many ways, it has. �

She wasn't relentlessly happy – in fact, she battled depression and her life was never easy. "My mom was smart, funny, energetic, and totally devoted to our family. She grew up on a hardscrabble farm in rural Colorado with four sisters and a brother and no indoor plumbing. She had near photographic memory, graduated from high school at 16, and left home at 17 to attend nursing school in Denver, paying her way working as a substitute teacher. She married my dad and started a family, and in 1941, they moved to Virginia, where I was born a year later. From my earliest memories, our house was the 'clubhouse' for every kid in the neighborhood. Think 'little rascals,' which later became 'big rascals,' and my mom was in the middle of all the action. If a child was missing, the parent generally called our house first. It wasn't just boys—the girls would come and talk to her about things they couldn't talk about with their mothers. She was a great listener.

"Long after my brothers and I were out of the house, friends of ours would stop by to say hello or introduce wives and girlfriends to Mrs. Veatch.

"My mother hated cruelty in any form. We were always taught to be kind and generous to 'those less fortunate.' There are many stories of her quiet but, on at least two occasions, direct physical intervention when someone was being abused. As a true stay-at-home mom of her generation, she never had a driver's license. The world she most cared about came to her. Happy Mother's Day!"


many people attending to be able to move around or walk.

As an internist specializing in medical cosmetics, I believe that beauty starts from within and every person looks his or her best when they are happy. It's imperative to follow a healthy lifestyle, including getting enough rest and exercise. It is also important to feel good about who you are, how you look and be able to enjoy little things in life. The key is to find a physical and emotional balance. REPS: 10 - 8 - 6 - 4 - 2

In this session you'll be counting repetitions (reps) of the exercises rather than using a timer.

Start by doing each of the four exercises for 10 reps then repeat the set doing two fewer reps each time until you get down to doing each exercise for two reps.


So you'll be doing 10, 8, 6, 4, and finally 2 reps.

What I love about this session is how the last circuit of only two reps feels pretty easy at the end, so you finish feeling energized while knowing you've smashed a hardcore session.

EXERCISES

- 1. WIV Abs
- 2. Spider Press Up
- 3. Surrender Squat
- 4. 180° Squat Jumps

WIV ABS



- 1. Lie flat on your back with your arms straight by your sides.
- 2. Lift your body up, pulling with your abs and pushing your arms straight forward.
- 3. At the same time, bring your knees to your chest. This is your "W."
- 4. Return to the starting position.
- 5. Lie on your back, with your legs and arms extended up. Keeping your legs and arms straight, raise your upper body while trying to touch your fingers to your toes. This is your "I."
- **6.** Return to the starting position.
- 7. Lie on your back, with your legs and arms extended up. Keeping your knees and elbows locked, simultaneously raise your upper body while driving your arms between your legs. This is your "V."

SPIDER PRESS UP



- 1. Start in a push up position with your hands planted on each side of your mat and your legs wide.
- 2. As you lower your body down to the floor, lift one knee up to the side and touch the knee to your same side elbow.
- 3. As you push back up, bring the leg back to starting position.
- **4.** Repeat on the other side.

SURRENDER SQUAT




- 1. Start standing up straight with your arms up, elbows bent and your hands behind your head and shoulders to ceiling.
- 2. Drop one leg back to the floor into a kneeling position. Keep as much weight as you can on the working leg. The other leg is just being used for support.
- 3. Stand back up without using your arms, then alternate, moving the opposite leg back to the floor.
- 4. Continue alternating legs.

180 DEGREE SQUAT JUMPS



- 1. Get into a squat position with your right hand touching the ground.
- 2. As you jump up out of the squat turn your body to the right so you land facing the opposite way.
- 3. Land in a squat position and touch the ground with your left hand.
- 4. Repeat, this time turning to the left as you jump. Continue alternating sides.

Courtney Crane of Studio City, California, one of the book's authors, explained her experience writing this story, "Dredging up this 40-year-old story and putting it on paper, was definitely healing. I was finally able to stop blaming myself for what happened to 12-year-old me. As a mother of a teenage daughter, I have more understanding and compassion for that little girl me, and just want to wrap some love and gratitude around her. I hope there's a woman out there who might read my story and be inspired to bring her own hidden story to the surface. Hopefully, she could forgive herself, too."


"One of the best ways we can extinguish the stigma and judgment with which so many women facing already-difficult issues around reproductive health, inequality, and gender-based violence are met is to tell our stories honestly, in human, personal terms," added contributor Elizabeth Futrell, of Chicago, Illinois. "In doing so, we not only create community and encourage dialogue, but we also honor ourselves and the experiences that have shaped us. And if we're lucky, we inspire others to do the same."

"We've come a long way, but we have a long way to go," said Robinson. "If women are to be treated as equals, with respect, under the law, and under our professional, domestic, and medical roofs, women need to share their stories. So many of us have experienced inequality, abuse, and varying degrees of mistreatment based around our gender. It is both sad and comforting to know other women have been through the fire and come out the other side, with scars, yes, but as survivors. And for those who have been lucky enough not to share in some of the worst situations in this book, they need to know that these things do happen, often. We have a long way to go, but we will get there, together."

Proceeds from both the show and book will benefit the National Network to End Domestic Violence (NNEDV). "At the center of our work are survivors' experiences and stories," said Kim Gandy, NNEDV President and CEO. "We are thrilled to partner with Better Said Than Done to lift up women's voices and stories of empowerment. We urge every person to speak out for survivors and build stronger communities together."

Sandra Hull, of Arlington, Virginia, shared a similar sentiment. "For far too long, I felt that my experiences were unique, but not in a good way, as if I failed at 'human-ing.' When I started telling my stories on stage, I was amazed when people approached me after shows to say how much they identified with what I'd talked about. That newfound connection empowered me to share a painful story from my childhood that I'd previously felt too ashamed to tell. I'll consider it a win if just one woman identifies with the story and knows she's not alone in her pain."





"CORE" TRAINING BY PAT MCCLOSKEY AND DOUG VASILIADIS OF ONE TO ONE FITNESS

e have received many questions about training the "core." Doctors want us to keep our core strong to help protect our lower back and alleviate lower back pain. Coaches want our core strong so we can be more resilient to injury and enhance our athletic performance. Gym goers train their core to feel healthy and fit and for some to strive for the elusive "washboard abs." Yet while the "core" is one of the most popular terms in fitness and athletic conditioning, many people do not have a clear understanding of what "core" means and how we train it most effectively.

Most people equate the core to abdominal muscles, especially the rectus abdominis which is close to the surface of our body and that gives those with very little body fat their "six-pack" look. While the abdominals are a component of our core musculature, our "abs" and our "core" are far from one-in-the-same. Our core musculature also includes many other internal muscles closer to our spine and pelvis, in addition to posterior muscles of our lower, mid, and upper back, our pelvic floor muscles, and many muscles surrounding our hips. However, while some may define the core as our entire mid-section, trunk, or torso (excluding the legs, arms and

head), the human body is meant to function as a unit and this unit also includes nerves, ligaments, tendons, and fascia. Fascia is a like our natural Spiderman suit; a vast web of connective tissue that is interwoven and wrapped around our muscles, joints, and internal organs, often with strands or sheaths that are integrated or connected from toe to head.

"Core" classes at your local health club and popular "core" workout videos are dominated by more isolative instead of entire-body integrative exercises, the vast majority of which are performed on the ground in a supine (on our back) or prone (facing down) position instead of standing on our feet. Doing things like sit-ups, crunches, scissors, and cycles certainly make us feel the burn in our abs, and the variety of planking variations do enable us to involve the entire body in a more integrated fashion, but these are incomplete. The fundamental movement that we perform in activities of daily living and in athletics (walking, running, bending, squatting, rotating, pushing, reaching, etc.) are accomplished with not only muscle contractions but with the integrated, coordinated involvement of our nervous system and connective tissue, and do not occur laying down on our backs, or flexing our spine (like with crunches), or even in planking positions. The most beneficial core exercises are done on our feet and include movements that involve and place demand on the entire body from toe to head and treat the body as an entire unit with all of our tissue working together as a coordinated "symphony," not with specific muscles "playing solos."



PAINLESS FIX FOR RECEDING GUMS



New technique repairs gums quickly with great results

Receding gums can cause a slew of problems


Adental breakthrough can correct receding gums without painful cutting and stitches - or the need to take time off from work for recovery. 
Here's how the "lunchtime gum lift" is done. Tissue is numbed with a local anaesthetic and a tiny entry point the size of a ballpoint pen tip is made above or below the teeth being treated. A special tool developed by Dr. Chao is inserted into the hole and moves the gum tissue into position. The surgeon then passes tiny collagen strips through the opening and inserts them under the gum. The strips keep the tissue in place until the patient's body produces new collagen to fix receding gums. The procedure takes about a half hour to an hour depending on how many teeth are involved.

The hole heals quickly and is almost undetectable in a day or so. Dr. Grande says this method replaces the old technique where "Dentists would have to remove tissue from the roof of the mouth and then graft it into the area where the gum had moved away from the tooth. "This can be a very painful and tedious procedure that requires a lot of downtime afterward." The American Dental Association says half of Americans between the ages of 18 and 65 already have receding gums, but the number of patients who have tried gum graft surgery is relatively low "because people perceive it to be an invasive procedure," Dr. Grande says. •

Individuals of all ages are welcome to let their inner artist shine and turn the plaza into a chalk art gallery.


Festival-goers can purchase a "plot" of brick space on the plaza and paint to their hearts delight whatever flows from their imagination.

May 20 & 21 at Reston Town Center Presented by Greater Reston Arts Center (GRACE)

he renowned Northern Virginia Fine Arts Festival has grown its reputation for many reasons, and now in its 26th year, it's a good time to take a look at why. To operate the festival, GRACE relies on the infusion of funding from top tier sponsors all the way down to \$100 for the Adopt-An-Artist campaign. Reston Community Center, Reston Town Center Association, The M Group Architects + Interior Architects, Wegmans, The Counter, and the host venue, Reston Town Center, are among the valued sponsors who provide important services and funding. Viva Reston Lifestyle joins the ranks of those who understand the event's significance and provide their support.

Another essential component of the festival is fundraising for GRACE, a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization. Philanthropy sustains its extensive year-round programming that brings 80,000 people to the gallery and makes it possible to serve 40 schools in the DC region with "GRACE Art" education. Festival artists rent booth space to sell their original paintings, mixed-media, photography, sculpture, jewelry, and fine craft, but GRACE does not receive income from art sales. Instead, a \$5 per adult donation is requested at the Northern Virginia Fine Arts Festival,

and in turn GRACE provides the robust program that contains details, art images, and dining certificates for local restaurants.

Innovative Entertainment

Throughout the 2-day event, Reston Community Center presents exclusive dance performances in the parks at Reston Town Center. The professional dances are choreographed to respond to the public art sculptures, providing another unique experience, along with pockets of acoustic music throughout the 11 blocks of the festival. A big draw to the event is the free Family Art Park in the Pavilion, where all ages get the opportunity make their own creations while enjoying GRACE's acclaimed activities.

Let the Festivities Begin – Friday Night at the Pavilion

Before the weekend of exhibits and entertainment begins, GRACE starts the festivities on Friday night at the Festival Launch Party in the Pavilion. All are welcome to join in the fun of the "creative cocktail attire" friend-raiser celebration and mingle with the artists. The ticket price of \$50 benefits GRACE and includes beverages, a build-your-own-burger bar from The Counter, the festival program, and a silent auction of exciting getaways, culinary workshops, spa and golf packages, and more.



Convening Fairfax Leaders to Maintain the

Strongest Community for All

n an early spring morning, approximately 50 executives from various sectors gathered at a prestigious law firm located at the Reston Town Center. They were participating in a community leadership program entitled "The Hidden Faces of Fairfax County." It was not lost on the participants that high above the restaurants and retail stores, the conference room overlooked the Embry Rucker Community Shelter located in the other direction. Despite being a thriving community with highly-educated and highly-paid residents with access to the best public schools, attractive parks, and cultural activities, Reston, as well as the broader Fairfax County region, has significant challenges – homelessness, food scarcity, public safety, digital divide, and more.

Solving these community challenges is a tremendous task; it requires collaboration between government agencies, nonprofit organizations, and corporations. Since 1987, Leadership Fairfax has been the catalyst for this collaboration. This organization assembles diverse leaders, across sectors and experiences, to increase their knowledge and perspectives on key local and regional issues. Leadership Fairfax accomplishes its mission through three signature programs – Leadership Fairfax Institute (LFI), Emerging Leaders Institute (ELI), and Lifetime Leaders Program. To date, Leadership Fairfax counts more than 1700 community leaders as graduates. However, the work doesn't stop at graduation. Graduates continue to serve the community, racking up volunteer hours each year. In the words of President & CEO Karen Cleveland (LFI '05) "There is still much work to do."

Celebrating its 30th anniversary this year, Leadership Fairfax has broadened its mission to provide an environment for challenging and strategic conversations, what Cleveland calls Leadership Fairfax 2.0. Already, Leadership Fairfax has brought leaders from all sectors to

the table to build and maintain the strongest community possible. One example is the Opportunity Neighborhood in Reston which launched last fall. Leaders from a variety of organizations such as Cornerstones, Reston Community Center, Reston Association, and YMCA Reston as well as many County departments, including Fairfax County Public Schools, came together to assess need, identify priorities, review existing resources, and determine strategies for filling the gaps, all with the intent of enhancing the quality of life for local underserved families and children.

One of the participants at the table was South Lakes High School PTA President Andy Sigle (LFI '14). He credits Leadership Fairfax for preparing him for his role as moderator of the initial public meeting because "the LFI program emphasized how imperative it is for government, nonprofits, and businesses to work together to enable a community to thrive." Further, as a Cornerstones volunteer, he is sees the impact of creating an environment where all children have the resources they need to succeed. YMCA Reston Executive Director Joseph Crawford (LFI'15) agrees. "One of the most impactful pillars of the Y is youth development. Opportunity Neighborhood is the best collective partnership the Y has to serve our children in Reston and we support it wholeheartedly."

If learning about local issues, sharpening your leadership skills and engaging in community conversations interests you, then apply for a Leadership Fairfax program and take a seat at the table. There's still much work to do to maintain the strongest community possible ... for all! *



Two years from idea to fruition, the doors of MurLarkey Distilled Spirits, LLC opened just days into the new year of 2016 in Bristow, Virginia. Thomas Murray had completed a successful career as a high-tech executive and was thinking about his next best chapter.

His cousin, Mike Larkin, had been toying with the idea of opening a distillery. Descendants of the Kellys, an Irish family that immigrated to the United States in the 1930's, spirits were steeply ingrained in their family traditions. In fact, in Ireland whiskey is often called uisce beatha, meaning the "water of life." It's something the Murray, Larkin, and Kelly homes knew and loved. MurLarkey® was born, named for, and run as a family business.

Take a tour and you'll see their immigrant story and the history of potato vodka and distilled spirits come to life. You'll learn that when the Irish first came to America they did not have their beloved potatoes, which were not indigenous to Northern America. So they turned to corn and a new American spirits business was born. An old copper still has a place of honor in a corridor, while in the operations center, their modern European distillery equipment is clean and sleek, stainless steel lined with copper with their signature crest poised artfully above. In their retail section, their spirits are available for sale alongside some great merch that captures the fun of your adventure. I'll be sporting

a great tank this summer that says, "It's Just Not a Party, Without a Little MurLarkey ... Distilled Spirits."

But, the real heart and soul of the company is reflected in their products. Jesse Puckett, their Head Distiller, has mastered the task of using the finest locally sourced, 100% natural, gluten-free corn and barley, Idaho potatoes known for their optimal moisture and high starch content, and local waters to drive the fermentation process to mash tank, on to the 600 gallon still, through distillation to the cooling condenser to produce the 160-to-190 proof vodka, gin, or whiskey base. A typical vodka is distilled four to six times in a run. MurLarkey's® award-winning Divine Clarity® is distilled 16 times resulting in an incredibly smooth and pure spirit. The company is so focused on the quality of their ingredients and process that they have trademarked "Farm to Flask™."

George "Papi" Zwetkow, is the creative genius behind the art of product development. What happens when you put a love of food (we're talking gourmet cook here), fabulous "nose," and a discerning palate together with natural curiosity and a hint of mischief? Great spirits. Papi has mastered the difference between what enhances the flavor of a gin or whiskey and what competes to its detriment.

I received an amazing short course in the use of chardonnay oak wine barrels to bring out the flavor in Clemoncy™, their finest whiskey infused with the highest quality dried lemon peels and zest, to be served chilled and neat or to form the base for a delightful array of crafted cocktails. Or the need for merlot oaken wine barrels to produce their cinnamon and brown whiskeys. Smoked or charred oak staves are added as needed to bring out the nuanced textures and flavors of their widening selection of spirits. Think gin is for old men or stuffy upper crust Englishmen? ImaGINation™ will change your mind. Forget any medicinal properties that might have lingered too long on your taste buds, this gin is delicately flavored with 12 botanicals including lavender, lemongrass, rosemary, juniper, ginger, and peppercorns amongst others, that delightfully grace your senses and can be served cold and up or mixed with grapefruit juice to form their "Floridian."

What I found consistent throughout the tastings was whether the spirits were served plain or as one of over 14 signature cocktails available for sampling, the character of the spirit itself was never overwhelmed or lost. A favorite was the Irish Red Head, their Cincerity™ Cinnamon Whiskey combined with orange juice and ginger beer. Another was the Cinnamule™, Cincerity™ with sweet cider and ginger beer. Served warm during the fall will bring cheer and cheers from any crowd. Justice™ is aptly named as it is perfect with just ice, or served with Zing Zang Bloody Mary mix, available at ABC stores and some local supermarkets. George suggests garnishing with crispy bacon for a truly Virginian cocktail experience. Looking for the perfect summer libation? Try Clemonade™, a blend of Clemoncy™

Lemon Whiskey, fresh squeezed lemon juice and a touch of simple syrup topped with club soda.

Over the last year, MurLarkey's® distilled spirits have become available at over 80 Virginia ABC stores and 70 restaurants from Fairfax to Virginia Beach. Several new whiskeys are in the approval process through the Treasury Tax Bureau and State Certification requirements, and they plan to launch their own line of bitters in the near future. As one of the fastest growing distillers in Virginia, they are not content to rest on their early success. Ked, White...and Green

VIRGINIA'S WINERIES COMMIT TO ENVIRONMENTALLY-RESPONSIBLE OPERATIONS

umber five in the nation for wine production, but still number one in our hearts, Virginia wineries and vineyards offer a pleasant respite from busy lives. With such beautiful settings and delicious quaffs, one can only relax and enjoy without thinking of the cares of the world.

Not so for the winery owners and winemakers, for many view the earth as under their care, and an increasing number of Virginia wineries are making a voluntary commitment toward sustainability and protecting and preserving the precious earth from which their bounty flows, putting "green" atop their list of reds and whites.

Their efforts to lessen their environmental impact include:

- ✓ Recycling, composting, and waste reduction
- ✓ Minimizing use of fertilizers and chemicals
- ✓ Harnessing of alternative energy methods to reduce water and energy consumption
- ✓ Geothermal heating and air conditioning systems

- ✓ Stormwater collection for flushing toilets and irrigation
- ✓ Organic farming
- ✓ Promotion of green events

This move toward sustainability is supported by the Virginia Department of Environmental Quality's Virginia Green Wineries initiative, a self-certifying program in which facilities must verify they are practicing green core activities. Currently 23 wineries are listed on its website.

Here are some of the ways Virginia's wineries are "going green."



Sunset Hills Vineyard

Located in Purcellville. green technology whenever possible. They installed 245

solar panels on the south-facing roofs of the winery and case storage buildings that supply 100% of their electrical needs,

making them the largest producer of solar energy in Loudoun County.

The solar panels produce 80,000 Kilowatt hours of clean power each year, thus reducing carbon dioxide (CO2) emissions comparable to planting 240,000 trees annually. They call it "turning sunshine into wine."

Other green initiatives include minimal use of chemical pesticides and herbicides, recycling vineyard waste such as spent grape skins and pomace back into the vineyard as fertilizer and weed controller, employing manual labor instead of motorized vehicles, and creating plant environments to attract bluebirds and beneficial insects.



North Gate Vineyard

Also in Purcellville, North Gate Vineyard features an environmentally-friendly 100% solar-powered tasting room built to LEED Gold Specifications—the first of its kind in Loudoun County and the second in Virginia. Through a 22 Kilowatt solar array, they generate enough energy to power their needs and sell excess electricity back to the grid for energy credits. Energy curious? View their solar panel monitor on display in the tasting room.

The tasting room also features local, reclaimed, recycled, and sustainable building materials and décor that include reclaimed wood tables, bar and mantle, with the bar top created from recycled wine and beer bottles (Enviroglass), a fireplace made from Shenandoah stone, and Cali-bamboo flooring. The building itself is highly insulated, using high-efficiency heat pumps for air conditioning, and plenty of daylight to decrease energy use. Even the landscape is sustainable, using native plants in a design created by the Loudoun Master Gardeners.



Cooper Vineyards

Louisa's Cooper Vineyards was the first Virginia winery, and only the second in the nation, to feature a LEED tasting room when it opened in 2011. Earning a LEED platinum designation, its stunning design, with a geothermal heating and cooling system and two complete walls lined with glass that extends upward for two stories, create an "indoor/outdoor" space that can be enjoyed regardless of the weather. The surrounding landscape seems to flow from the windows, fostering the impression that the tasting room is an outgrowth of the vineyards themselves.

Built with the aid of a USDA grant, the \$1.5 million green building also features low-flow fixtures that reduce water usage by 40%, low-voltage LED lights, solar panels, and a 50%-recycled countertop.



Veramar Vineyard

Wanting to be one of the leaders in sustainable grape growing in Virginia, some of the practices used at Veramar Vineyard include planting of beneficial cover crops, safe and controlled spraying of soft pesticides such as biodegradable oils, soaps and plant extracts, and conducting ongoing research into environmentally-friendly methods of pest control. Their philosophy is to ensure that the land remains healthy and productive for future generations.



Gadino Cellars

Pulling from the Italian traditions of their grandfathers, the owners of Gadino Cellars in Washington, VA believe that growing and making wine with their own hands is the way to recreate the tradition of a small farm market where people can buy fresh and local. Similar to sustainable farming, the grapes are grown on their own land, and by using modern equipment with minimal processing, their fresh wines avoid heavy preservation methods often found in large production wineries.



Loving Cup Winery and Vineyard

Going organic is another way Virginia wineries are going green, like with Loving Cup Winery in North Garden. It is one of one a few certified organic wineries on the East Coast, earning its certificate after three years demonstrating strict adherence to organic farming federal guidelines.

Being organic means agricultural practices that do not use synthetic substances, like designer pesticides and fungicides. In addition, the term "organic" can only be used on a label if every step of production has been certified, including the materials used to manage the vineyard.


Loving Cup's method is to grow grapes organically, using hybrid varieties that are fairly resistant to mildew, rots and other diseases, and to maintain a robust population of beneficial insects that keep the bad ones at bay. Their idea is to "farm with nature instead of against it," using the entire ecosystem.

Enjoying Virginia wines has never been difficult, and now they can go down even easier, with the knowledge that each glass helps the environment. •

As spring rolls in, work on Phase 2 of the Silver Line continues to spiral ahead.

"Good weather has continued, and work never stopped during the winter months," said Charles Stark, vice president and executive director of the project which is being built by the Metropolitan Washington Airports Authority.

Construction of the rail system, including tracks, stations, and supporting infrastructure is more than 56 percent

complete and construction of a 90-acre rail yard and maintenance facility on Dulles Airport property is almost 50 percent done, according to Stark.

Major progress has been made on the components of the aerial guideway that will carry trains through Dulles Airport as well as the pace of construction along and above the Dulles Greenway in eastern Loudoun County as the tracks head to the terminus station being built in Ashburn.

According to project and construction manager John Kearney, "the project will see several dramatic changes taking place over the coming months at all five stations now being built in the median of the Dulles Airport access highway and the Dulles Greenway. As the precast erection and concrete placement continues, the structural steel will top off the stations giving each the same signature look of the Silver Line at grade stations that are now familiar in the first phase through Tysons Corner and west to the east side of Reston.

Phase 2 runs from the Wiehle-Reston East Station westward to Ashburn through Dulles Airport.

At the airport station, which is along the front of the parking garage opposite the parking bowl from the station terminal, precast girders are now in place on both sides of the Dulles Station and work speeds along on the aerial guideway decks and tracks near that station.

Along the Greenway and median of the Dulles International Airport Access Highway (DIAAH), installation of concrete ties and track will continue and retaining walls continue to stretch from the east to the west to be followed by installation of fencing, Kearney said.

The hand mining work beneath the highway is drawing to a close. This work has attracted lots of attention as crews struggled to dig out utility tunnels, by hand, through extremely dense rock known as diabase (granite) which had proven to be too much of a challenge for traditional tunneling methods. Hand-mining required a lot of "crawling on their knees" for workers charged with these tasks, according to senior project manager Stephen Barna.

Soon, pedestrian bridges to provided access for rail users to and from stations to parking areas and adjacent plazas will begin. This work will require lane closings and some traffic delays. The first of the installations will take place at the Innovation Center Station and will connect that station to the future pavilion on the south side of the Dulles Toll Road and DIAAH.

Here are some highlights of recent work:

In March, the final aerial guideway girders at Dulles International Airport were set in place near Saarinen Circle. The four 84-inch tall precast concrete girders measure nearly 140 feet long, weigh approximately 95 tons each, and will support the Silver Line Metrorail trains that will run through the airport.

Once complete, the guideway will be more than three miles long and connect the east segment of the Silver Line Phase 2 in the median of the DIAAH with the west segment that will run in the median of the Dulles Greenway. Also, overnight detours along the Greenway allowed project crews to construct a large concrete span for the Silver Line aerial guideway over the eastbound lanes. •



LEPTOSPIROSIS Should Not Be Ignored

ven if you have never heard of the tongue-twisting word "Leptospirosis," you may start seeing it pop up in the news, as it is the subject of a number of recent outbreaks in the Northeast and Midwest, and at an increasing rate of infection.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), Leptospirosis is a bacterial disease that affects humans and animals, caused by the corkscrew-shaped bacteria genus Leptospira. It may cause a wide range of symptoms that may be mistaken for other diseases, or it may have no symptoms at all.

In pets, younger animals are more seriously affected, and symptoms can include refusal to eat, diarrhea, abdominal pain, vomiting, fever, severe weakness and depression, stiffness, muscle pain, and the inability to have puppies.

Infected animals, including farm animals, horses, dogs, rodents, and wild animals can spread the disease to humans or their dogs through their urine, which goes into the water or soil and can survive there for weeks or even months. Infected animals can carry the bacteria for up to several years.

Humans can contract Leptospirosis through contact with urine or other body fluids from infected animals, or contact with infected water or soil taken in through ingestion, mucous membranes, or broken skin from a scratch or cut. Children are at most risk of acquiring the bacteria from an infected pet.

Symptoms in humans usually occur in two phases. The first includes fever, headache, chills, muscle aches, vomiting, or diarrhea, after which the patient may recover or relapse. About 90% of cases are mild. It if progresses to the second phase, it becomes more serious, with symptoms ranging from yellowing of the skin, bleeding from the lungs, meningitis, to even death.

How does my pet get Leptospirosis?

Your pet is most likely to get Leptospirosis by drinking, swimming in, or walking through contaminated or stagnant water, most often in areas where infected wildlife such as raccoons, opossums, squirrels, skunks, or deer live. Dogs rarely pass the infection to each other, although the risk is higher if your dog has spent time in a kennel. The most common culprits are rodents.

What is the treatment?



Once your veterinarian has confirmed Leptospirosis through a series of tests, it is treatable with antibiotics, which are especially effective if your pet is treated early. Additional treatment methods such as dialysis and hydration therapy may also be required.

VIP Petcare holds monthly petcare clinics, like the ones held at Pet Valu Falls Church (The Shops at Stonewall) where pet owners can get affordable preventive veterinary care without an appointment. (Use "Find a Clinic" on the VIP Petcare website). "VIP Petcare charges only \$33 for the preventive vaccine, and there is no office fee at any of our clinics," said Medical Director Katryna Fleer, DMV. "We want to make it convenient for anyone seeking preventive care."

Leptospirosis prevention

The most effective way to prevent your dog from contracting Leptospirosis is with a vaccine. Although it is not 100% effective, it does provide immunity from most strains. In addition, rodent control will aid in cutting down the risk of spreading the disease.

To avoid getting the bacteria yourself if your pet is infected, wear protective gloves, and avoid direct contact with your pet's urine, blood, or tissues during the time of infection. Do not assist with the birth of puppies. Take care to wash your hands after handling your pet or their excrement. When cleaning surfaces that may be contaminated, use an antibacterial solution of one part bleach to 10 parts water.

People who work around animals such as farmers, fish workers, slaughterhouse workers, animal caretakers, and veterinarians are at the highest risk to come into contact with the bacteria, as are mine and sewer workers. Humans can also pick up the disease by swimming, wading, kayaking, or rafting in contaminated lakes and rivers, or walking through muddy or marshy areas, with the risk higher in tropical or temperate climates.

The CDC reports that although Leptospirosis occurrence in the U.S. is relatively low, it is the most widespread zoonotic disease in the world.





Opening Lead: 🏚 J

'Look at this silly play my partner perpetrated,' a player told me after a team event. 'He won the first spade in dummy, pondered—and let the ten of diamonds ride! West won and led another spade, and partner won and took the ace of diamonds. Luckily, his play cost only an overtrick. The other South in 6NT took thirteen tricks, of course.'

I always hate to hear someone backstab a partner—especially with misguided comments. To make 6NT, South must play the diamonds for one loser. If they break 3-2, any play works. If East has, say, Q-9-6-5, or if West has Q-J-9-6, South is sunk; he can handle a 4-1 break only if East has a singleton honor or if either defender has the singleton nine.

If West has the bare nine, East can't gain by covering the ten: South loses only one diamond. If East covered the ten with an honor or played the nine, South would take the ace, return a diamond and cover West's card.

What North should have done behind South's back was pat it.
